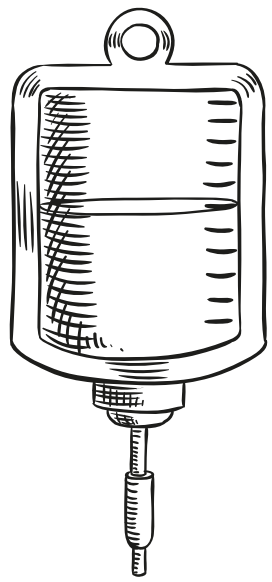
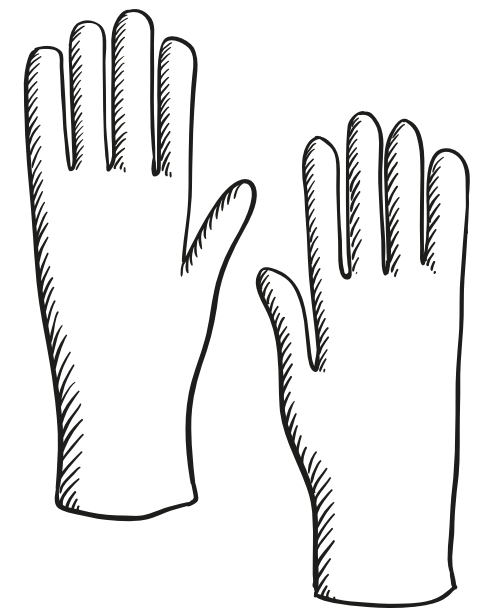
The EU Action Plan on Organ Donation and Transplantation

for all European patients

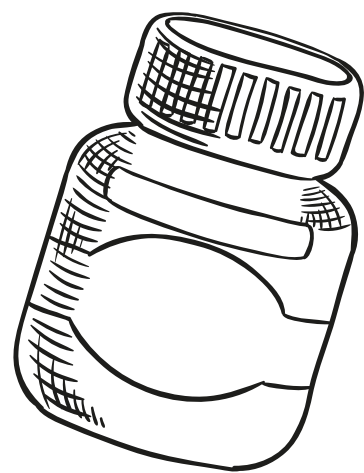




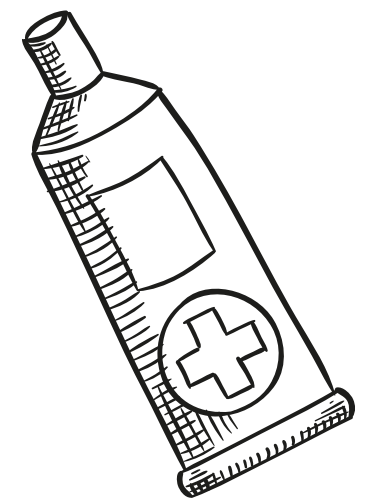
2010 - 2019



Less than **50%**
of European countries
achieved a greater than **20%**
increase in organ transplantation,
whilst others showed a decrease.
